GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Hold at least a private pilot certificate.
2. Be able to read, speak, and understand the English language.
3. Hold at least a valid third-class medical certificate.
4. Pass a knowledge test as well as the practical test.

FLIGHT REQUIREMENTS

1. At least 50 hours of cross country flight time as pilot in command:
 - At least 10 hours must be in airplanes for an instrument airplane rating.
2. A total of 40 hours of actual or simulated instrument time:
 - At least 15 hours of instrument flight training from an authorized flight instructor;
 - One cross country flight in an airplane that is performed under IFR conditions and consists of:
 - ◆ A distance of at least 250 nm;
 - ◆ an instrument approach at each airport;
 - ◆ three different kinds of approaches with the use of navigation systems.

3. A total of 10 hours may be in an approved "PCATD" simulator.

NOTE: 15 hours of instrument flight instruction is just a minimum set by the Federal Aviation Administration. Most pilots will require more flight instruction.

Payment Options

Pay As You Go: Pay for each individual lesson with cash, check, or credit card.

Prepay: A 5% discount is given for cash or check (no credit card) deposits of \$500 or more. These savings can exceed \$250 when training for your private pilot certificate. For example, if your account has a zero or a credit balance (you don't owe any money to Wisconsin Aviation) and you pay \$1,000 into your account, we will credit you with \$1,050. This is the most cost-effective way to pay for your training.

Open an Account: Request and complete a credit application and then submit it for approval. The approval process may take up to 10 days.

You must use "Pay As You Go" or "Prepay" methods until credit is approved.

Financing: Secure your own loan or take advantage of Wisconsin Aviation's financing plan. Please ask for a copy of the current financing plan. I understand that the terms of my account are net 30 days, and a finance charge of 1 1/2% per month will be charged on any outstanding invoices (18% per annum).

Cancellation Considerations: I understand that if I need to cancel a lesson, I will do so at least 24 hours in advance or I may be charged for the time scheduled. I understand that if I miss a scheduled appointment without proper cancellation, I will be charged for the time scheduled.
